Re: Proposal to Prepare the Peace River Airport Business Plan

Thank you for the opportunity to submit a proposal to work with the Peace River Airport Review Committee to develop the Business Plan for the Airport. Please accept this letter proposal as my submission to work with the Review Committee and prepare the Peace River Airport Business Plan.

It is understood that the consultant will be working with a 13 member Review Committee representing all of the municipalities that have a vested interest in the success of the airport as well as tenants of the airport.

It is also understood that preliminary work has been completed on a regional governance model for the airport. The primary purpose for this phase of the study is to determine the strategic/business model for the airport.

This proposal has been prepared based on the scope of the Request for Proposals:

a. Consideration of pricing policies, capital planning, operational forecasts, strategic planning and economic development and diversification to be included within the planning initiative.

The consultant will review the current rates and fees schedule of the airports involved in Aviation Alberta, review the current costs for capital construction projects for airports, prepare projections for flights and use of the airport and therefore project the operational needs of the airport. The consultant will consider the long term vision and objectives for the airport and consider the potential economic multiplier effect of the airport. The consultant will also review the economic opportunities on the airport lands, the opportunities for diversification of uses on the airport property while retaining the aviation uses as the main priority and ensuring the airport provides the community with a functional airport that can provide emergency services and ongoing, and increased, passenger flights.

Airport lands are generally divided into three main categories: airport operational reserve (which includes runways, taxiways, navigational facilities, terminal building and aprons), airside development (hangar lands with direct access for aircraft to the runway); groundside development (land that can be developed but does not have direct runway access and while aviation related uses

are preferred, are not mandatory). The Business Plan will identify the main goals and objectives that will then assist with the development of an appropriate land use schedule.

b. A focus should be given to the significance of the geographical location as well as the opportunity of positioning the airport as a regional service centre when developing the business case.

Northern Alberta has challenges in terms of services, access and attracting people and businesses. Access to Edmonton City Centre Airport is still threatened with the possibility of full closure by the City of Edmonton. If this occurs, what air service will be available to Peace River? Airport service is provided in the "spoke and hub" system. Does this mean that any airline traffic will go to Grande Prairie and then to Edmonton or Calgary, and how will that impact the cost of the flights, the timing of the trips, the frequency of the trips. This is critical for the north for medical services, access to international travel, access to government etc. The study will look at the threats and opportunities for air travel to and from Peace River.

Over the past 32 years Patricia Maloney has had many opportunities to work in the north. I understand the opportunities and the challenges of northern locations. I have also worked with many airports that have geographical challenges (and those challenges do not always translate into northern locations — for example Medicine Hat Airport cannot compete properly for regional air traffic because it is less than 3 hours from Calgary and people will drive three hours rather than buy and airline ticket). My work experience with the High Level, Rainbow, Zama, La Crete and Fort Vermillion airports has also provided me with experience with remote locations, airports ineligible for federal grants, and small remote populations. All of these challenges will be applicable to the Peace River experience.

c. A defined process for the development of a business plan that includes milestone dates and a completion date.

It is recommended that the development of the Business Plan take the form of a strategic planning session for the second meeting with the Review Committee. The consultant will review all available background materials and develop scenarios to be considered at this session.

This session will provide background for the development of the capital plan and the determination of the future land uses and diversification. Milestones and targets will be identified in this Business Plan allowing for future budgeting, grant applications, fundraising and measuring success.

This session would take a full day, or afternoon and evening (with a lunch or dinner break) and the process for that session would be as follows:

d. A confirmation of availability for a minimum of four in-person meetings (start-up, draft review, open house, and final presentation).

Pat Maloney is available for four in-person meetings in Peace River. It is anticipated that the consultant will have input into the scheduling of the dates of the meetings. It is proposed that each meeting will include a trip to Peace River and an overnight stay to maximize the value of the trip and incorporate into the trip site visit, meetings with other stakeholders and review of any other documentation the Town may have regarding the airport.

e. A confirmation of availability of project timelines.

The Request for Proposals does not outline a specific time line. However, given the fact that there will be four meetings in Peace River and background work to complete, it is anticipated that the project could be completed approximately 4 months after the contract is awarded. If the Town of Peace River has a different time line or requirements, Ms. Maloney is very willing to discuss this and adapt the time line.

f. A cost quotation for this undertaking inclusive of travel, accommodation and disbursement costs.

The fees are calculated at \$1000 per day for 8 days. Expenses are based on travel to Peace River by flying to Grande Prairie and driving to Peace River with 1 night hotel in Peace River for each trip. Also included is a daily meal allowance of \$60 for each trip to Peace River. Expenses are estimated and will be billed at actual cost with no administrative charge and all receipts will be provided. It has been assumed that the Town of Peace River will cover the cost of advertising the public

consultation meeting and other meeting rooms. In addition, the Town of Peace River will provide equipment such as digital projector and easels. The consultant will bring laptop computer and other research materials.

I have been to Peace River and have previously assessed issues at the Peace River Airport for the Town.
